OAHU, KAUAI & ISLAND OF HAWAI'I KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

When exploring the Hawaiian Islands, it's important to be prepared, so check the weather and pack accordingly, especially when venturing into the mountains. Wearing sunscreen is key, but keep in mind that Hawaii law requires coral-friendly sunscreen, without any oxybenzone or octinoxate. Each island has its popular natural, historic and cultural attractions. Here are some tips to make your exploration of the Hawaiian Islands easy, carefree and gentle on the environment.

OAHU	Diamond Head State Monument	6:00 A.M. – 6:00 P.M. daily. Closed Christmas & New Year's Day. Last entry: 4:00 P.M. (on trail by 4:30 P.M.)	\$5 entry \$10 parking	Up to 30 days in advance. The park is busy at certain times and may sell out. Reservations are recommended. No refunds for no-shows and late arrivals.	Arrive within 30 minutes of reservation (strictly observed).
	Hanauma Bay Nature Preserve (HBAY)	6:45 A.M. – 1:30 P.M. Wednesdays – Sundays. Local residents with a valid Hawaii identification may enter without a reservation from 6:45 A.M. until 9:00 A.M. Residents arriving after 9:00 A.M. need a reservation or walk-in ticket. All HBAY visitors must leave the nature preserve by 4:00 P.M., with the beach being cleared at 3:15 P.M. Schedule is subject to change at any time.	\$25 entry \$3 parking (\$1 for residents)	2 days in advance starting at 7:00 A.M. Hawaii Standard Time (HST). Tickets are limited and in high demand. If you are unable to make an online reservation, you may purchase a walk-in ticket to the park when it opens at 6:45 A.M. Walk-in tickets are limited, sell out very quickly, and must be used that same day.	Tram ride up and down is included. Everyone must watch a mandatory 9-minute safety video before going down the hill.
	Pearl Harbor Visitor Center	8:00 A.M. – 4:00 P.M. (Last admission 3:00 P.M.) Closed on Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.	FREE. Fee to store bags of all sizes including luggage.	Reservations and tickets are not required to enter the Pearl Harbor Visitor Center, Pearl Harbor National Memorial, walk the grounds, or visit the museums.	Strict no bag policy. Any bag that offers concealment (purses, handbags, backpacks, fanny packs, camera bags, diaper bags, luggage, etc.) exceeding 1.5" x 2.25" x 5.5" is NOT allowed at the monument. Visitors may use the same bag storage and parking stall for visits to all Pearl Harbor Historic sites. These security measures are strictly enforced.

Catching a sunrise or sunset at Haleakalā, Maui's highest peak at just over 10,000 feet above sea level, is a momentous experience you don't want to miss.
